A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Cight Wins

Last month, I wrote that we "enter into familiar territory as the season of Lent begins." Wow. Remember way back when we thought we could <u>choose</u> what we were "giving up" for Lent? Doesn't that seem like an eternity ago now?

Some of you are reading this as ones who are enjoying a slowing down of life, while others have felt their lives grow more hectic, with more daily challenges either due to workload or

children being home all day. May God bless you and yours as we adapt to this new reality.

During this season of "social distancing" we are streaming live for worship each Sunday on the Hoffman United Methodist Church Facebook page. In addition, we are also recording DVDs of the traditional service, if there are those who are not internet

proficient. Unless something radically changes, this is our reality through Easter (Bishop Palmer has asked UM Congregations to suspend live worship through Easter).

If you are like me, many daily decisions are now focussed around what trips in our lives are truly "necessary." As we journey through this season when we may be craving something "normal," I offer this familiar Scripture:

Psalm 23:1-6 The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters. He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil; my cup runneth over. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the LORD for ever.

Too often associated with funerals, this is a Psalm of comfort for for any trial God's people go through. Whether we like to admit it or not, we are like sheep, and we need the Good Shepherd. This Psalm has come to mind recently as so many of

our plans and expectations have been upended. There are times when we are made to rest, even when we would prefer not to. Sometimes we are guided away from places we want to go, but for our safety, we are forbidden. Though luxuries may be in short supply, the reality for so many of us is that we do have what we need, even if not what we want. Sometimes doing the right thing is enough in its own merit, even if

economic harm is an unfortunate side effect. We are often reminded that both the challenges and the blessings are shared both by our friends and by our enemies. Through all these things our faith challenges us not to fear death, for whether we live or we die, God is with us in that journey, and Jesus the Christ is preparing a home for us when that day comes.

As we face the reality that we will likely not worship together for Easter, more than ever we need to be reminded that God's people have throughout human history experienced famine, wars, droughts, and plagues. 
