A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Moving Closer to the Light



Revelation 22:5 5 And there shall no longer be any night; and they shall not have need of the light of a lamp nor the light of the sun, because the Lord God shall illumine them; and they shall reign forever and ever.

I believe I took both of these pictures in 2002, soon after graduating from Ohio University (go bobcats). Some of you may tire of me mentioning this trip Bridget and I took “before kids,” but it does come to mind often. I traveled with multiple cameras, lenses, and rolls of film. I wanted to get THE snapshot of the lighthouse where we stayed at the lightkeeper’s house, a bed and breakfast in which our room had a view of the light at all times. Of course I wanted to see the light at night, but I did not plan to take many pictures, as I was using film, and I had my doubts I could get the quality I wanted. In recent years we have been spoiled by digital cameras letting us see our pictures right after we take them.

The host at the house insisted that we really needed to go to the lighthouse after dark, and so we did. Though the lightkeeper’s house was only about 200 yards from the lighthouse, the difference as we got closer to the the light was stunning. From a distance it appears there is a single beam as the light source is focused through the lens. As we walked closer, we could see there were 2 beams, then 4, then 8, and when finally we stood in the yard of the lighthouse, it appeared there were countless small beams of light that were panning over us between the main larger beams. I have been to multiple peaceful places over the years, but I’m not sure I have ever felt more at peace in a particular place than with this canopy of light shining over me. It was mesmerizing, and as I feared, the picture I took didn’t do it justice, but still connects me to this precious memory. In this case, the light was merely shining “over” me. Darkness still surrounded me, but I didn’t have the same

uncertainty in the darkness I normally would. In John’s Revelation, which includes a vision of heaven, there is no need for a lamp or for the sun as the Lord God is the great illuminator, filling all shadows with Divine light.

One of the many lessons I remember from this moment at



Heceta Head Light was how my location impacted my experience. When I was farther from the light, I knew it was there, and still experienced its power and beauty, but it did not compare to when there beside it.

I think it can be that way in our spiritual lives as well. Maybe we get accustomed to being a certain distance “away,” and we still marvel...but various other things keep us from getting too close...or worse, we feel a little farther away than we used to. We can in our minds reason

accurately that God does not move, but it takes a bit for the realize we have been moving away, and how. Before you think I’m talking about you, I want to be clear I am talking about me.



It has been 18 months unlike any I have had in my life. Too many times I have put on my shoulders the (false) responsibility that it was up to me keep people safe; to keep the congregation virtually connected; to keep families or households from leaving. Don’t get me wrong, I think efforts were and are necessary, but with each time I put the pressure on myself, and depend on my power, ingenuity, or will...I’m not depending on God’s. And another

imperceptible shuffle away from the light happens. I write this in the midst of a very active week of Vacation Bible School, just before my family and I take some time away. It is true of course that this is vacation, but it is also true that I hope to use the time and space to allow myself to take more steps back toward God’s Light. Stay near the light friends!

Mission and Ministry

There was an update on the anti-racism prayer service that was held 6/13/2021.

Pastor's Report

The average attendance for May was 125.6; 9:00am 47.6 in person, 26 online; 11:15am 42.2 in person, 9.6 online. Robbie shared an overview of statistical tracking of attendance, which shows a gradual rise in attendance. Norman plans for Chancel and Bell choir to restart in September. Becky is updating the Safe Sanctuary training.

Registration for VBS is available online. Joseph is meeting weekly with the youth and looking ahead to the plans for the Fall Pastor Robbie plans to take a vacation day once a week during the summer months. The directory has been distributed. The directory app which is yet to arrive allows the church to add additional attendees for the next 4 years. We should be able to add a link to the service and link to a bible app through the directory app. Father's Day treats are ready. The plan is to return to use of bulletins on July 4th. Sunday July 25 will be a "VBS worship" Robbie has vacation scheduled for July 26-August 8.

Trustees

The contract for stained glass repairs requires 10% down with no need for progress payments. The project is approximately 2 weeks' worth of work. We are next in line after the company completes projects already scheduled through August. The boiler needs to be replaced. Our current boiler is rated for 30 years and we have had it for 42 years. The trustees recommend accepting the \$32,000 quote from Bolyard, Greenville, for 2 new high-efficiency boilers including a \$3600 rebate for high efficiency units. The board approved for Trustees to engage in a contract for the new high efficiency boiler with Bolyard at \$32,000 +/- 10%. The board approved \$15,000 out of the endowment fund and \$15,000 from Trustees checking. The trustees are considering an alternative pest control contract.

Finance

The finance report for May was reviewed and accepted. The report indicates we have 7.11 weeks of operation available with current income. There was a strong ending to May

Non-agenda Items Janet gave a report on the 52nd session of West Ohio Annual Conference which was printed in the June newsletter.

Joy Paulus has requested to no longer manage the Sunday School attendance books. Julia Circle will be the next Sunday School Superintendent as part of secretarial duties. We will continue the current books and tallying procedure.

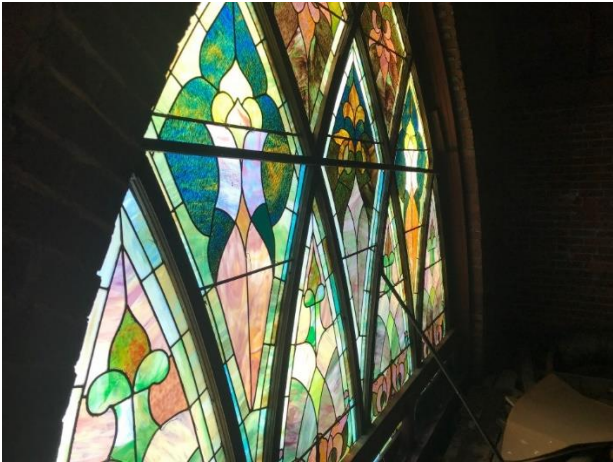
Future-Seekers Class Bible Study

Hoffman Stained Glass Window Restoration Project Update July 2021

Background: The trustees noticed that Hoffman’s stained-glass windows are in dire need of restoration. There are several windows that have gaps where the glass has separated from the frame and lead comes, and some of the saddle bars that support the stained-glass are broken. The restoration companies told us that the storm windows that protect the glass need to be vented. There are 18 stained glass windows in the church, ranging in size of 70” x 70” to the large 116” x 128” window above the front door that is in the worst shape. **The glass has sagged so much that there are gaps between glass and the window frame and the window is in danger of falling in if it is not repaired.**

Update: Through July 25th, we have had \$73,345 contributed to the stained glass window restoration fund, with a pledge to sponsor one additional window for a total of \$80,055, or 73% of the \$109,430 projected cost. Thank you to everyone that has donated to the window restoration fund and thank you to the Miltonian Women's Club, the Methodist Women, the Methodist Men, and Grandma's kitchen for their donations and helping us to restore our windows. Please prayerfully consider sponsoring a window or donating any amount to help us reach our goal of \$109,430. A memorial plaque recognizing the sponsor of the window will be added if desired. 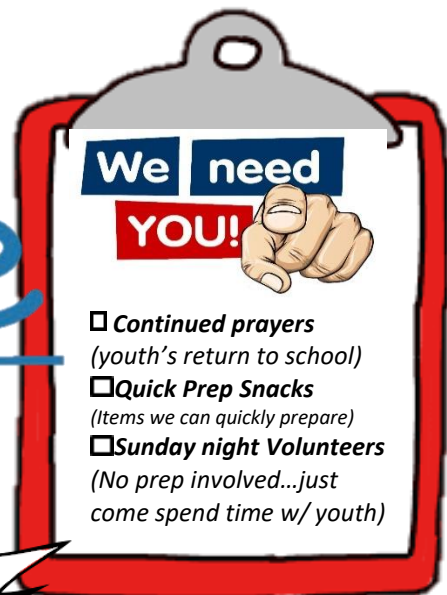

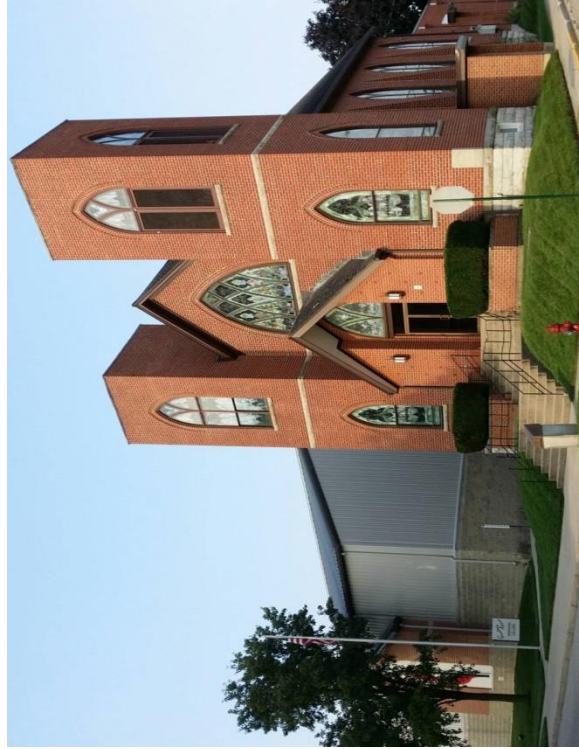
