A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

God at Work in the Dark

Psalm 119:105 Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path.

I am certain it will be no surprise to you that there are things that we don't "see" until it finally grabs our attention. It can be that way with the design of our homes or vehicles, or sounds, or even people. I will every so often challenge us to "see"

someone that the world seems to be ignoring. These are examples we all have our blind spots. I was surprised to notice such a thing with themes in Scripture. I've made no secret of my enjoyment of the contrast of light vs darkness in the Bible, and have often come back to that theme in various ways. However, something that slipped by my notice, was the work of God IN darkness.



I often speak of God's timing and how convenient grace is at work before we are aware of it. It is also true that when we go through difficult times we may not be as aware of God's work and presence, but lack of awareness denies not its power. The picture I included is a scene that my daughter and I photographed during vacation. I had for years wanted to take night pictures of the Gateway Arch, but time and opportunity had not intertwined on previous trips. There was also the issue of the park where this view is possible. When last we saw it in daylight, it looked rough, and had warnings about not defecating on the buildings...ew. The view across the river was glorious, however, so after reading some recent google map reviews that made it sound like it was safe for nighttime public visitors, we made the trip.

This was one of the many highlights of our time away, but it did remind me that I do "want" to see light at work IN darkness. The pictures I shared many months ago of the Hoffman sanctuary lights at night were intended to encourage in this way.

Recently then, I was surprised to notice the number of

times in Scripture that God, the Author of light, is at work IN the darkness. This work was in various types of darkness, I might add. You and I both know that darkness isn't just about our physical world, but also impacts our spiritual and emotional worlds, as well.

In recent weeks I sheepishly noticed the reality of the familiar passage I shared at the beginning of this writing. How nice it is how the psalmist shares that God's word is a lamp to our feet and path...but that means by necessity it is at work in darkness. We don't need lamps during brightly lit times. But we certainly notice and need them when we are in the dark! Sometimes when it comes to God, we need reminders that God is at work at all times, even when we are in great darkness, or if you

prefer, "in the valley of the shadow of death."

And so, these last couple Sundays I have been sharing in worship some passages and stories from the Bible showing God at work in the dark, when characters we either remember or are being introduced to receive help from God in a moment of darkness. As one who was afraid of the dark when he was a child, my suspicion is there is someone suffering from fear in their own time of darkness, and I pray these accounts will serve as reminders to encourage us on our journey together. Speaking of encouragement, allow me to share one more passage reminding us of how God sees our darkness.

Psalm 139:11-12 11 If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me," 12 even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you..

No matter the darkness you are going through, I pray you are able to see God at work in the dark. While remembering God's work of light in times of my darkness,




