A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

*What We Will Be...*

**1 John 3:2** “Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is.”

I have again had the pleasure of serving as an extension of the District Office by presiding over the annual Charge/Church Conferences in part time congregations in our region (“part time” is strictly a salary designation, but certainly not a statement of their work and ministry). It brings back memories of the work I was a part of just before being appointed here. I get to hear the stories of ministry and the ways that congregations have celebrated and mourned over the last 12 months.

I am somewhat embarrassed to admit it has been nice to know that other congregations have been thrown off balance as ours has (We try to not highlight that when Sundays come, but yes, a very difficult season of ministry). Sometimes knowing we are not alone in our pain...that others share it; sometimes that knowledge can help us endure.

Bishop Palmer has invited presiding elders to contemplate and to share a short word about the passage above, from 1 John 3:2. Admittedly, I was not excited about the Scripture. It contains words that I share at every single funeral I officiate. The funerals the last couple years have been painful. I do realize nearly all funerals are painful, and in the Christian faith they carry joy at the same time...but yeah, pain. At the time of this writing I am attempting to weave a narrative of some stories of one whom I shared a lot of chuckles with, who also shared my enthusiasm for flannel shirts. The picture many may recognize as an online screenshot from our time of remembrance during worship on All Saints Sunday.

Often I would have liked to have had another conversation with, shared another joke with, or even fussed with, some of those who have gone ahead of us in the journey. “What we will be has not yet been made known....” This means not even we know yet what we will be. We are in the midst of a season in

which Hoffman has multiple high school seniors making plans after graduation, and I would hazard a guess that many of them have some idea of what they think they will be doing. When I was a senior, I was going to be an Electrical Engineer, but obviously I was incorrect. Even those who correctly look ahead will likely have twists and turns in their lives that they never saw coming.

**1 Corinthians 13:12** **Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.**

I hope it is a comfort to you to know that the One we serve does not know us by our job title, or by the compliments (or insults) others may have aimed at us. The One we worship does not know us by our family lineage, but instead Fully

knows Us. We do not even fully know ourselves, and yet God does. A couple years ago we had a worship series based on a book “Life of the Beloved” by Rev. Henri Nouwen. It has been over 25 years since he died, but his books still impact many today. At the core of his teaching was that in a sense the truest identity of who we are can be summed up as, and lived out of recognizing ourselves as “Beloved

of God.” From how we think of ourselves, to how we are in ministry with and for others, this awareness could change our reality, and in turn change the world.

One thing that must be at least acknowledged is that congregations also have identity, and the last 18 months have challenged our flexibility and resilience to all that is going on around us. Our mission continues to be making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, and we invite the Holy Spirit to empower that work today, and in the future.

While recognizing I only know myself in part, but I serve One Who fully knows me, and knows you, I am, In His service and yours,

JoAnn is working through Charge Conference paperwork and not recommending any names for removal from membership. Preparations for pumpkin carving family event Trunk-or-Treat are underway. Bulldog Bag packing has resumed. Youth event is at the corn maze on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup>. The cost for Trunk-or-Treat candy bars was split between youth and ARP. Pastor Robbie is presenting over 6 Charge Conferences this fall. Jim Mitchell is attending the Legal Forum via Zoom. Volunteer Opportunities still in need Includes: hospitality/welcoming, ushers, service through tech support, virtual outreach. A new walking club has started. The 2021 Progress Report of Breakthrough Goals was shared.

Breakthrough goals were discussed and will be included in Charge Conference Minutes.

### Trustees

A summary of the Stained Glass restoration was given. A discussion was held regarding the rental policy costs and the need to review and update charges.

### Finance

The finance report for September was reviewed and accepted. Weeks of Operations available has increased to 7.14. There is improvement in Cash compared to balance, but still low compared to budget. 
