

Mark 8:17-18 <sup>17</sup> Aware of their discussion, Jesus asked them: "Why are you talking about having no bread? Do you still not see or understand? Are your hearts hardened? <sup>18</sup> Do you have eyes but fail to see, and ears but fail to hear? And don't you remember?

A younger, slimmer version of myself recorded a video called

"Jesus is in Our Boat" while rowing around a small lake in Kentucky. If you look up that title with "Pastor Robbie" you should find it pretty easily. Recently I have looked at this passage more through the lens of sight. My eyesight has been one of the many blessings of my life. No matter what else you read on this page that might sound accidentally like I'm "complaining," please know that I know I am blessed. From my

childhood I have had good, or even Very Good eyesight, better than 20/20. Looking back, I could see how that blessed me in countless ways. Thought I am not known for being a detail oriented person, I think of all the negatives and snapshots I looked through when I worked in a photo lab, while also a photographer. I could see even on a negative when an image wasn't quite sharp enough, or on the snapshot I could spot an eye blink on the back row of the group picture... I loved being able to see the sharp details that made one picture just that little bit better than another.

I have noticed a change over the last couple years. I have had more difficulty seeing some things clearly. My son would hold something up to my face in order to show me something, and with a look of frustration I would push his arm farther away until the item would actualy look like Something, and not just some blurry mass. Many ingredient labels have necessitated the bathroom lights to be able to read it, and items with "fine print" require me to take a picture of it with my phone, and then pinch zoom to see if I can make out the words. My eyes are not as good as they once were. The good news is, they still aren't so bad, still test pretty close to

20/20...but I don't see things as I once did. Because I do so much reading and working on a computer, I have been fitted for reading glasses for the first time. I think younger me would have fought this, but "this" me took a look through some of the testing tools and went "oh wow, Yeah, that is MUCH clearer." Therefore I now step gingerly into this phase of


my life, a stage where the statement "where are my glasses?" will likely be heard on a regular basis, but also a stage where I will again see clearly.

I was already planning to have some kind of 2020 Vision series this year because, well, it is 2020, and there are probably countless pastors either who have already gone that direction, or are working on it currently. My particular "take" on this series is

about the Standard...What if we measured our vision not against "normal," but against the standard of God's Vision? Of course, you, me, anyone, we all fall short of that standard, but what about a series that reminds us in various ways that God sees the world and people differently than we sometimes do? What if the topics and scriptures bring to light things that our eyes haven't "seen" before? What if we could see the world and the people around us in a way more similar to how God sees them? Maybe there will even be opportunities to "see" God at work all around us in ways we never noticed before. This is my particular hope, as the Old Testament, the Gospels and the Epistles often ask..."Do you have eyes but do not see?" As you well know, the question has nothing to do with physical eyesight, but a lack of awareness, or stubbornness. or failure to recognize what is displeasing to God. Just as I welcomed Dr. Poling to help clear my physical vision, I pray we will invite God to help correct our spiritual vision.

With eyes open to see the kingdom work of God going on all around us. I am.

#### February Voice of the Martyrs

Hello friends. We have come into a new year with more blessings than we can count, but also with many challenges in our nation and around the world as we press forward toward the goal of spreading the good news. My focus this month is on the countries of Turkey and Syria. Turkey is traditionally a Muslim country. Now the country has approximately 174,000 Christians. The government there remains in many tense situations. Among many, Turkey is sending troops to Libya to stop the country from being taken over by ISIS and Al-Qaeda, which in fact would put our Libyan brothers and sisters in a terrible situation. Turkish Christians face most of their persecution from family members and discrimination from the authorities. Christians have no access to state employment. In 2019 at least 24 families were forced to leave the country because of their beliefs. These situations can be very confusing as Turkey supports Russian led rebels in another neighboring country such as Syria. Northern Syrian Christians are said to be living in somewhat of a panic, due to war and invasions. Kidnappings of children are common. The everyday struggle to survive is intense. Churches are attacked, even Christian schools are attacked. This is a very sad reality of our time but we can at least stand with Christians in love and this prayer is from the Voice of the Martyrs website and I wonder if when you read this you would consider praying this for one week, once a day.

Heavenly Father as war and fear, famine and death surrounded us; we put our trust in you. Lead me, Lord, to do your will even if it means giving up my life for you. Please do a mighty work in this region and bring many others to believe in the true God, Amen.

Remember as so many in these countries feel Islam has failed them they ask other Christian there about Jesus, many are being saved through these conditions and for that we can praise our God for choosing such incredible warriors to advance his Kingdom. Until he comes, Marijo Schlecht


