A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

FREE INDESD

John 8:34-36 Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

This is the time of year when it is normal to hear about Freedom, and being Free...but while in the most abnormal of years in my lifetime, we especially this year have had

conversations speaking of being free, and having freedom. Freedom of speech, freedom to peaceably assemble, and freedom of religion, and the question of whether all have the same freedom to pursue happiness continue to vex our country today.

A few weeks ago I was in an exam room in a medical facility hearing profanities being shouted as someone was upset at how their freedoms were

being taken away by having masks required in some places. I admit in that moment I would have liked to have been free to not hear the tirade, but apparently that was taken away as well. Moments like this have had me thinking about what we are free to do or not do.

Freedom is woven through Scripture, too, from the very beginning, when humanity was free to eat from any tree in the garden but one...and yet still were free to eat from the forbidden one, though consequences necessarily followed. It is difficult to list off the various freedoms covered in Scripture, but maybe it is helpful to consider as a lens Ecclesiastes 3:1-7, and how there is a "time" for everything under the sun. One could also say we are "free" to do all those things....to build up, to tear down, to weep, to laugh, to gather, and to scatter, and so much more.... We are free to do countless things, and we are free to refrain from it, whatever "it" is. Each and every choice comes with consequence, both to our advantage and disadvantage. In the New Testament the apostle Paul puts it another way:

1 Corinthians 6:12 "I have the right to do anything," you say-- but not everything is beneficial. "I have the right to do anything"-- but I will not be mastered by anything. (NIV)

We are free to do things that help benefit both others and

ourselves, but sometimes we have to choose whether our actions or words are going to benefit others, or ourselves, with possible exclusion of the other. I admit it has troubled me that on an airline that if oxygen masks are dropping from the ceiling I should care for my needs first before the needs of my companions. Caring for oneself makes it possible to care for others, and yet the John passage reminds that what we are

"free" to do could also be what enslaves us.

At Hoffman we are attempting to allow everyone in the congregation freedom to encounter worship in as many methods as possible, depending upon each one's assessment of health and comfort level. At the church building we can gather in the sanctuary or there can be a live feed in the Activity Center for those wanting to be present, but distanced. We will continue to offer the live stream online, and DVDs are

being recorded each Sunday. If you would like more information regarding any of those options, please don't hesitate to reach out. We will continue practices to attempt to keep everyone as safe as is possible. All are free to come, but all are also free to protect themselves and loved ones as they see fit, as it is obvious the COVID-19 virus isn't going to be completely gone for some time to come. Throughout this time we have and will do our best to make certain all feel Free to worship here.

This is just one in a list of circumstantial Freedoms, but all pale in comparison to the Freedoms we enjoy in the United States, and is barely worth mentioning compared to the Freedom from sin we all can have through Jesus Christ. While we continue to declare THAT Freedom through the Good News to all who will listen, we will deal with these various challenges around circumstantial Freedoms, and try to do so with Grace and Love, as would bring glory to our Heavenly Father.... because Light Still Wins over Darkness. Thanks be to God.

Board Meeting Highlights

Devotions: Devotions were led by Carol who shared about "key words" missing from common and significant passages in scripture. When these passages are missing "key words or phrases" greatly change the message.

Special Operation: The board received Wendy Heisey into full membership.

Mission and Ministry: Robbie gave "live streaming" updates and solicited feedback from the board. New hardware, which was funded by donations, improved the ability to stream and update the sound and improved the ability to watch services from the nursery. Robbie will work on setup of live streaming so someone would be able to step in if he was unable to be at service. The board discussed the procedure for "reopening". We reviewed and discussed West Ohio Conference "Return to Public Church Guidelines" as well as Governor DeWine's website updates. Return date of June 7 allows time to communicate to the church and create signage for return. Trustees to check with our insurance regarding liability of reopening. Hymnals, bibles, bulletins, offering plates and pew pads will not be utilized. Pews will be wiped between services. Attendance will be taken in preparation for possible contact tracing. Safe social distancing procedure with every other pew roped off in-between. No Sunday school or gathering in greeting areas Communion will be individually packaged. Masks recommended. Live streaming will continued to be offered

Nominations: Dan Studebaker was accepted into the position of SPRC Co-Chair

Pastor's Report: Average attendance for April was 143, with more watching that do not "sign in".

Numbers for 2nd service have declined, as mentioned families with small children have some difficulty with logistics of settling to watch. Joann has been working with her new computer and software. Becky provided updates regarding options for VBS. The board would like to have VBS if it can be done safely. Robbie has Jury Duty in June. It was recommended that someone besides Robbie be trained to keep the live streaming running. Robbie is finishing his 8th year on the Board of Ordained Ministry, he has accepted the request to serve 4 more years. Pulpit fill planned for Aug 2, Tom Weeks.

Edition: May 2020

Finance: Income versus budget has been about \$1400 short each month since "stay-at-home" started. There is still 6.3 weeks of operating buffer. The capital value of the endowment was reduced by \$15,000 for the first full quarter of the year due market decline. We received a \$500 dividend check from the Bureau of Workers compensation. Methodist Men gave a 10% tithe from hog sausage sales. John presented options for "online" giving. We will revisit next meeting.

Staff Parish Relations: Job descriptions were reviewed. No updates indicated at this time.

Trustee Update: The streaming unit to improve the online services was purchased with donations and Trustees paying the difference. The floor wax unit in the Activity Center was repaired. Jason Antonides was hired to apply fertilizer and weed control. Action Blacktop will seal the parking lot. Hubbard roofing to repair the Northwest Sanctuary downspout and propose ways to fix roof leaks in the nursery, the narthex, and JoAnn's office. Young Spirits will store their risers in the garage. Plans for mulching the flower beds in May and painting the garage in June. Stained glass window restoration will be explored.

Non-Agenda Items: The 2020 Art show has been cancelled. The 2021 Art Show will be July 30-Aug 1, 2021.

As we continue our journey through this season of COVID-19, I want to update that we have an additional option for worship, as our Activity Center is now hardwired to the sanctuary video feed. For any and all who come to the sanctuary but feel that even with the separations between the pews it is a little crowded, there is an option that allows for personal space. I have to admit that I have been in empty rooms enough the last few months that I have had to get used to being around groups again. In case this is also true for some of you, this is now an option (in addition to online). There is a minimum amount of preparation necessary, so please communicate with me or the church office if this is an option you would like to have ready for you or your family, and we will make it so. -rs
