
You are reading this May edition of the Towers, but I am composing this article in April. It was April of 1997, 25 years ago, at a Spring District meeting, that my life took a change in direction. My District Superintendent had a side conversation with me about wanting to introduce me to a church charge. I had written a letter to him saying that I was experiencing a call to ministry, and that I would appreciate guidance for my next steps. I realize on the outside that may sound like I knew what was going to happen, but I truly had no idea the timetable would go so quickly. Less than 2 months later I was "introduced" to a charge, and that July started serving in Morgan County at Pisgah UMC and Chesterhill UMC. (the word "Introduce" did not mean the same thing to me then as it does now! 😊)

In the moment that I finally wrote the letter, I finally "gave in" to a call I had fought for over a decade. Throughout the process, some of the challenges that had been expressed throughout my childhood came up in various steps of licensing, etc. I have been reminded in a variety of ways how my personality and tendencies are not what are typically looked for...let me just say we normally equate the word "professional" with "calm." (Scripture never asks pastors to be "professional," it turns out) Living into the reality that God called me in particular, despite my challenges and tendencies, has been difficult at times, and I am ever so grateful to those who have been sources of encouragement and support from those earliest days in 1997 and on through a global pandemic that had all of us pastors uncertain what the best course of action was next.

I occasionally speak of serving on West Ohio's Board of

Ordained Ministry, but I don't think I have shared here my first response to the invitation. The request was a letter printed on fancy paper, with the crest of then West Ohio Bishop Bruce Ough, inviting me to serve on the team that determined the ordained elders, deacons, and associate ministers that would continue the call after each generation is gone.

I think my first response was that I stomped through the house for 10 minutes grumbling about all the reasons why there was no way I had time or temperament for such important work, identifying all the reasons why "someone else" should do it. But then I remembered how I felt frustrated for the



difficulties that new pastors faced, and would occasionally reach out and try to encourage them in any way I could. I remembered how I expressed in my prayers that I wanted to be able to do that more...and then I looked again at the letter, an invitation to be a part of the journey of our next pastors to serve the United Methodist Church, an opportunity to possibly catch someone else coming to grips with the fact that despite all the ways we think we are ill qualified for a nearly impossible task, God still calls and empowers whomever God chooses to call and

empower, no matter our personalities and tendencies. Over the years I have watched God call various persons into local ministries, as well as to international and ordained ministries, and I have seen how all we human beings resist entering into "kingdom doing" based on our perceived weaknesses. Allow me to encourage you, no matter your age or perceived strengths or weaknesses, answer God's call, for if God calls us, God will equip us.

Hebrews 13:20-21 20 May the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, 21 equip you with everything good for doing his will, and may he work in us what is pleasing to him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Pastor’s Report

February attendance had an overall average 126.25 which is +17 compared to January. The 2019 average attendance was 153. We are edging closer to pre-pandemic. JoAnn has finished Conference Year End Reports. She has been going through the “welcome bag”, which was not current through the pandemic. Norman has been helping to investigate the replacement of the broken sanctuary projector, which projects for the choir. Temporarily the “retired” activity center projector is being used. Our current District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Jocelyn Roper, retires at the end of June. She has served a long term of 8 years. Rev. Dr. Jim Wilson II will be starting July 1. The West Ohio conference will be reducing the number of Districts from 8 districts to 6 districts. Years ago it was reduced from 14 to 8. Districts are being combined with no change in the mapping. Pastor Robbie has been attending various trainings offered by the Conference. He has 4-5 people interested in membership.

Pastor Robbie’s vacation, July 28-August 9; Rev Tim Benkert confirmed for July 31 pulpit fill. Dick Martens is confirmed for Sunrise Service Easter Morning. Pastor Robbie shared some resources from a “Trauma Stewardship Clinic”.

Trustees Information regarding our liability insurance was shared and discussed. Our liability insurance covers only events that are “church sponsored.” For any other events, patrons would need their own coverage. The board asked for clarification on the definition of “church sponsored” events.

Finance The finance report for February was reviewed and accepted. Weeks of Operations equal to 7.98 weeks. The Endowment Fund has lost \$8,500 due to market fluctuations.
